
German ODA contributes to achieving international climate-financing goals

Ambition: From 2020 climate finance at least 4 Bn. EUR per Year. Now approx. 5.6Bn €


- >17,5 Bn. USD adaptation-finance ODA (2011-20);
- Increasing funding for dealing with Losses & Damages, e.g. climate risk insurance

Climate-ODA compared to all ODA (in Milion USD)



Significant contributions through Multilaterals

- Increasing financial significance of multilateral contributions;
- 2,5 Bn. USD core contributions; 2,4 Bn. USD earmarked contributions (2011 bis 2020).



Direct Support to National Determined Contributions (NDC) and Adaptation Plans (NAP) is effective


- Interventions with direct Support to NDCs and NAP-Prozesses are mostly effective;
- Most countries have NAPs; NDCs include increasingly Adaptation components;
- Little direct support to LDCs;
- Cooperation mainly through TA; FC-Instruments, like PBL, are rarely used





Vulnerable countries do not receive more support

- 20% of commitments go to countries with high climate risks, 60% goes to countries with a low risk;
- SIDS have no increased probability to receive German commitments (neither bi- nor multilateral).
